FIRST CIRCULAR



The upgrading of European culture from the study of ancient Greek and Latin texts increased the literary production. The recovered use of ancient forms of expression allowed a broader scope on human nature and on the history of the human European societies.

Especially in the sixteenth century, the structures of social power and government have undergone a major renovation, as far as the geographical exploration built new frames for European's cultural horizon.

The humanist scholars, benefited from the printing intense activity, did root firmly their studies from the ancient sources.

One of the main branches of study was human nature. The human world was perceived as separated to the natural world. This philosophical attitude influenced deeply the arts and not only the literature. There was a unitary conception of beauty and a search for plenitude through personal growth.

León was established on site of a Roman camp. In addition, the way of Saint James is crossing our landscape to the West. The strong flow of Renaissance culture has left its mark in 16th and 17th century. Then, we invite all of you to reflect together the splendid results by the current Neo-Latin scholarship, encouraging the explorers of the yet untrodden paths.
